Early Admission

To apply through this track, you must:

- ✓ Be enrolled full time at a participating institution in your first semester of college
- ✓ Earn at least 27 hours of College Credit from high school (Dual Credit or Early College HS)
- ✓ Have two semesters of General Chemistry completed with grade of "C" or better.
- ✓ Plan to graduate in three years
- ✓ Meet all other JAMP criteria

Regular Admission

To apply through this track, you must:

- ✓ Be enrolled full time at a participating institution in your second year of college
- ✓ Complete at least 27 hours of undergraduate credit during 1st year
- ✓ Have two semesters of General Chemistry completed with grade of "C" or better.
- ✓ Meet all other JAMP criteria



JAMP Criteria

(Full criteria available at www.texasjamp.org)

- ★ **Attend a Participating College or University.** Apply to and enroll in a participating Texas college or university full-time the fall semester immediately following graduation from high school or a home-school program.
- ★ **Take the SAT or ACT.** You must earn a score higher than the state average. For the current state average, please visit our website at <http://www.texasjamp.org/students/become-a-jamper.html>.
- ★ **Apply for Financial Aid.** You must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) no greater than 8000.
- ★ **Earn a 3.25 GPA or higher.** Earn a cumulative 3.25 minimum and 3.25 BCPM GPA in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Math courses (No more than 3 hours of AP credit can be counted toward the 27-hour requirement).
- ★ **Meet with the JAMP Faculty Director (JFD).** The JFD at your school will provide academic advising and assistance in applying to JAMP. Contact your JFD prior to beginning your application to JAMP.
- ★ **Be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident and be a Texas Resident.** Please refer to our Texas residency page for more information.
- ★ **Apply to JAMP.** Click on the 'Student Application' link at the top right side of any page of our website. You may begin the online application on May 1 and must submit the completed application no later than September 29.

What is JAMP?

The **Joint Admission Medical Program (JAMP)** is a special program created by the Texas Legislature to support and encourage highly qualified, economically disadvantaged students pursuing a medical education. Funded through the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, JAMP is a unique partnership between nine Texas medical schools and sixty-six public and private four-year undergraduate institutions.

Since 2003, JAMP has helped Texas students achieve their dreams with guaranteed admission to one of the state's nine medical schools, financial and academic support to help them get there, and access to resources that allow them to excel.

JAMP Provides

- Support through **undergraduate scholarships** and summer stipends
- Placement into **JAMP Summer Internship** experiences
- Hands-on experience through **clinical enrichment** opportunities
- Comprehensive, multi-phase **MCAT preparation** program
- Personal and professional development through **dedicated mentoring**
- **Guaranteed** admission to a Texas medical school if all criteria are met
- **Scholarships** to attend medical school

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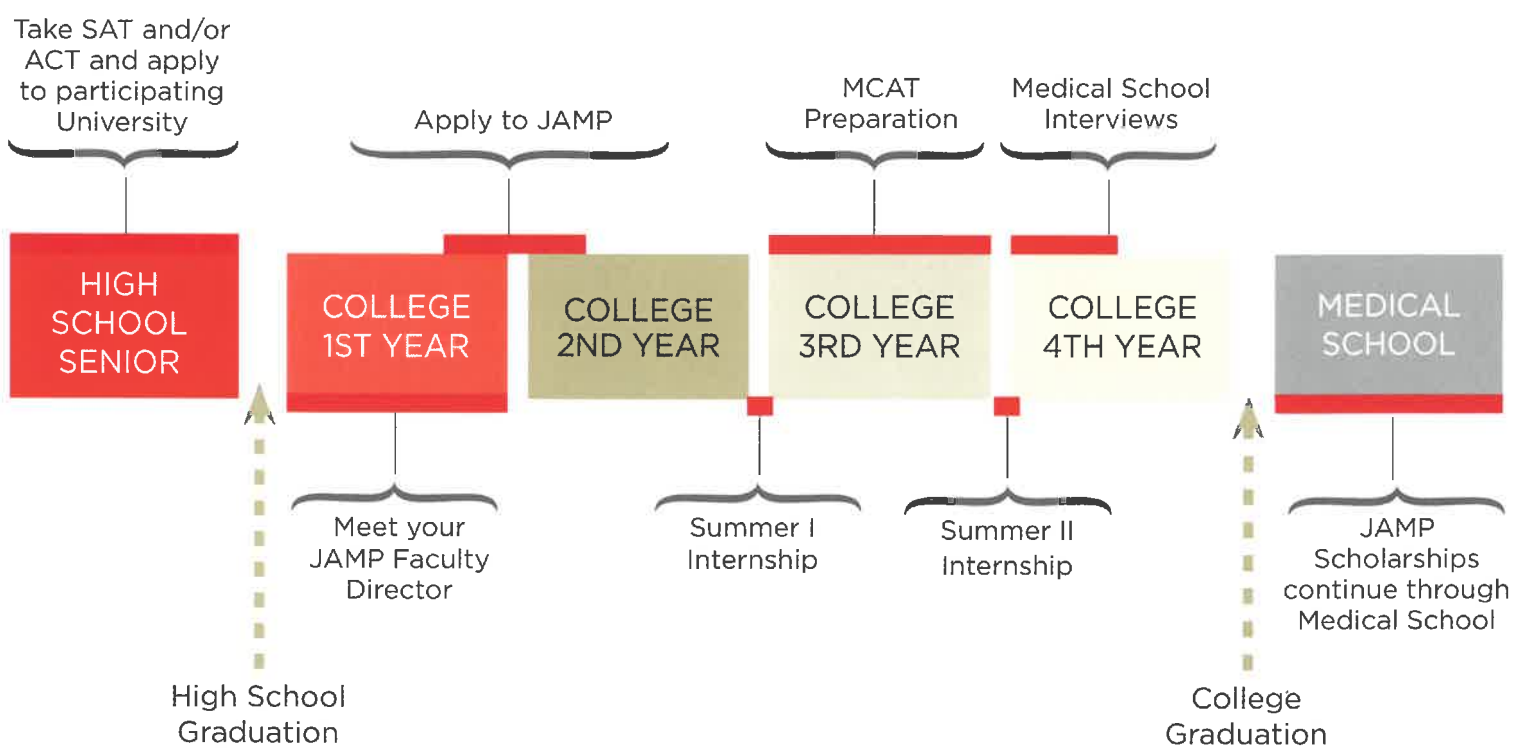
JAMP Application Criteria

- **Attend college for one year**
 - Begin by the fall semester immediately following graduation from high school.
 - Complete at least 27 hours of undergraduate credit during your first year of college after graduating from high school.
- **Attend a Participating University**
 - You must be enrolled full time at a participating university at the time of application to JAMP.
- **Earn a 3.25 GPA or higher**
 - Cumulative 3.25 GPA minimum
 - Minimum 3.25 GPA in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Mathematics (BCPM) courses
- **Take the SAT or ACT**
 - You must score higher than the state average. For the current state average, please visit our website.
- **Be a U. S. citizen or permanent resident, and a Texas Resident.**
- **Apply for Financial Aid through FAFSA.**
 - Expected Family Contribution (EFC) must be 8000 or below.
- **Apply to JAMP**
 - JAMP application is available on our website from May 1 through October 1.
 - Students must apply to JAMP by October 1 of second year of college.
