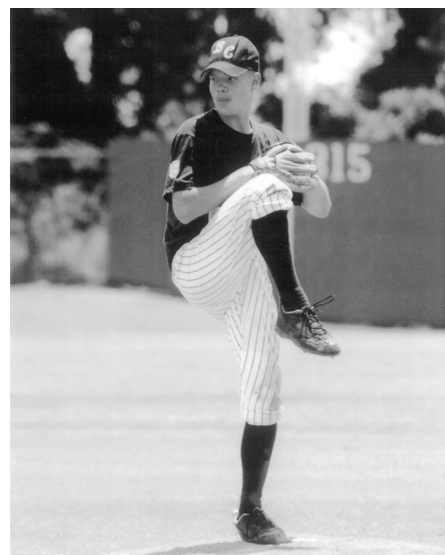
Bobby Briggs - Baseball

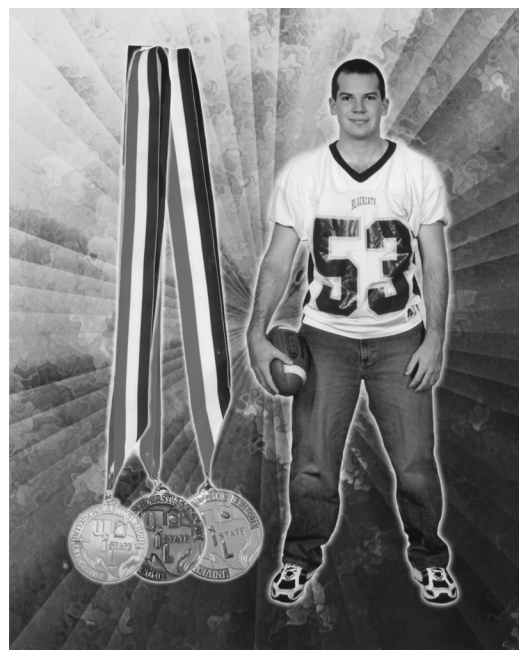

Family Statement - "Craig loved competing and being part of a team. Playing football as a Blackcat allowed him to do that. In the 2001 playoff game when the center was injured, Craig never hesitated as he switched positions from tackle to center. From that game until he graduated, the center position was his. Craig was a Blackcat through and through. Coach Eddie Nelson was his freshman coach; he gave him great encouragement and prepared him for the varsity. He was promoted to varsity at the end of his freshman season. During the 2000 playoff run, he ended up hospitalized when it was discovered that he was diabetic. After three days in ICU, he was back in uniform for the next game. Coach Nelson later said about Craig, "If everybody had the heart of Craig Grebe, we would never lose a game."

He had an insatiable desire to learn, especially in math and science. He had many great teachers who helped him on this journey, and he credited them with his getting a scholastic scholarship to Tulane University. Mrs. Frankson, Mrs. Crain, Mr. Gray, and Mrs. Saucier taught him basics that would carry him throughout his years at Tulane and on into medical school. As he got older, he often mentioned those who had an influence on him. He always remembered Ms. Hunt and how she made sure there was his "food of choice" from the cafeteria since he would get in the cafeteria line late after giving himself his insulin shot in her office.

Due to his early death in 2011, he cannot personally thank each who had such an influence on his life. However, his family would like to acknowledge the part that many individuals both at BCISD and in the community played in making Craig the man that he became. We are, and always will be, grateful for the guidance, caring, and teaching each of you gave to Craig."

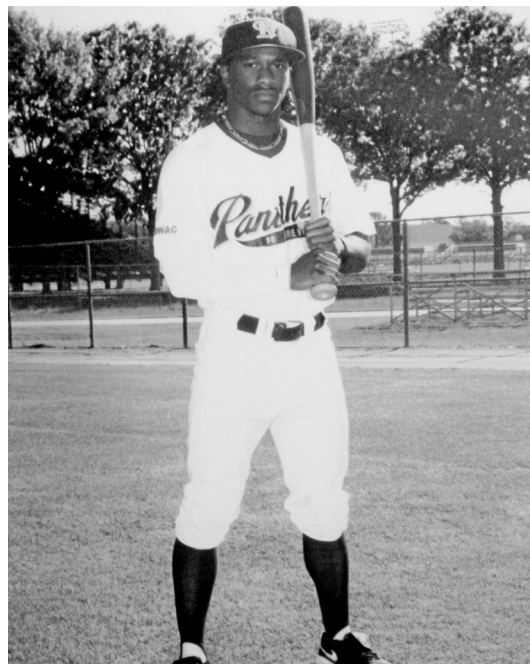

BLACKCAT HALL OF FAME Selection Criteria

INDUCTION CEREMONY: Last home football game of odd-numbered school years, usually the last week in October or first week in November.

PURPOSE: To recognize former Blackcat, Lady Cat, or Hilliard High School athletes or head coaches who have distinguished themselves beyond “the norm” and who have represented our community at a state or national level.

LOCATION: Foyer of the coaches offices at Bay City High School. The public is welcome to visit during regular office hours.

CRITERIA FOR NOMINATION:

Coaches:

- Must have been the Head Coach of a BCHS or Hilliard High School sport
- Automatic induction for State Championship

Players:

- Must be out of high school for at least five years
- Must have completed four years of college eligibility and participation with some special recognition or excellence

(or)

- High School State Champion in individual sport
- First Team All-State in any sport
- THSCA All-Star game or High School All-American designation
- Professional career (at least one full season)
- National or Olympic Champion
- Teams: State Champions or State Finalists

SELECTION COMMITTEE: Made up of several long-time community members and/or school employees

NOMINATIONS: Nominations may be made by current or former coaches, family members, teachers, community members, or the media

NUMBER: Eight to 12 athletes and one to two coaches every other year -- in odd-numbered school years

We would like to give special thanks to the group of community members who serve on our selection committee. Each of these individuals have been attending Bay City athletic events for at least 30 years, and some have more than 50 years of “Blackcat experience.” In August of odd-numbered years, they meet to consider nominations and make selections for the Hall of Fame.
