"Although I excelled in both basketball and football where I made the varsity in both sports as a freshman, tennis was the sport that would later define my young adult life. I taught myself to play the game by hitting balls against the outside brick wall of the Hilliard Gymnasium hours at a time. I would sometimes walk from the Southend to the USO to play pick-up games on their tennis courts. The courts there were made of concrete and had a smooth surface, unlike the asphalt surface on the Hilliard tennis courts. Sometimes on asphalt, the ball would take a bounce that you could never anticipate.

There was an African American professional tennis player named Arthur Ashe who became my inspiration. After finishing college in 1971, I became an Assistant Teaching Pro at the McLeland Tennis Center in Fort Worth, TX, in the summer of 1971.

It was there a year later that I first met Mr. Ashe up close and personal. Each year the Colonial Country Club would host the World Championship of Tennis (WCT) and Arthur Ashe along with other professionals of the day such as Ken Rosewall, Rod Laver and Stan Smith would come to Colonial for the tournament -- I never missed that tournament as a spectator.

In 1972 while in Forth Worth for the tournament, Arthur Ashe came to the McLeland Tennis Center to conduct a tennis clinic. This was my first meeting of the man who was now my idol. I received the thrill of my life when he asked me to restring one of the half dozen rackets that had a broken string. During our brief conversation he asked me, 'Why don't you start a National Junior Tennis League?' I had never heard of the National Junior Tennis League. He explained that it was a tennis program designed to introduce inner-city kids to the game of tennis. The program was sponsored by the Coca Cola Bottling Company and he was one of their spokesmen.

Six months later, Fort Worth had its first National Junior Tennis League conducted at the Sycamore Park Tennis Courts provided by the Fort Worth Park and Recreation Department. In 1975, Arthur Ashe became the first African American male to win at Wimbledon. Wimbledon was and still is the most prestigious tournament on the professional circuit. I like to think that he won with the racket I had restrung three years earlier.

I would go on to play in many amateur tennis tournaments throughout Fort Worth and Dallas and I have the trophies to prove it. I also was fortunate enough to give tennis lessons to wives of three professional baseball players with the Texas Rangers: Alex Johnson, left fielder – wife, Judy; Ferguson Jenkins, Pitcher – wife, Kathy; and Jim Bibby, Pitcher – can't recall wife's name.

My thanks to the Blackcat Hall of Fame Selection Committee for honoring me as an inductee and allowing this opportunity to share my story.

Completed his TLU Bulldog career as the TLU D3 leader in all-purpose yards with 4,282, the D3-era second-leading rusher with 1,818 yards, and as the all-time D3-era kick returner with 1,942 yards.

Set the the D3-era season-rushing record in 2007 with 1,066 rushing yards. Broke TLU's rushing record for rushing for 231 yards in one single game.

"I am truly honored to share this day with great people. This is such a blessing as I think of all the goodness the lord has done for me. Words cannot explain the feeling that I have over me right now. Never would I have thought this day would have come. Yes, I thought about how amazing it would be to be put into the Bay City Blackcat Hall of Fame with such great distinguished people. But I had no idea it would come to pass. All I can say is THANK YOU LORD.

I just want to thank my parents because without their love and support I would have given up in junior high. I can remember the first time I started football at seven years old. My dad was the coach, and when your dad is the coach it's probably going to be a tough go for you. Every night my dad would make me do 10 push-ups 'just because.' About the age of 10 it was up to 20 push-ups, but by then he wasn't telling me to do push-ups -- it was myself.

Growing up in Bay City as a little kid, I looked up to all the great athletes that have come through and paved the way for guys like me. I had always wanted to be a running back, so I looked up to older guys like Robert Lee, Reggie Jefferson and Adam Pointer. All three of those guys were great running backs and I wanted to be just like those guys.

running backs and I wanted to be just like those guys.

I had great coaches that believed in me and pushed me to that point where all you know is being a champion. My 9th and 10th grade season playing under Chad Morris, and 11th and 12th grade under Alan Cherry -- both coaches and their staff helped me become the man I am today. You hear all types of stories about when you get to college how the coaches are not the same - they don't care about you. But for me it was different. Once I got to college I played under Dennis Parker. He was like a godfather to me -- not just on the field -- but he helped me off the field. It was an honor playing for all three coaches and I have NO regrets."

Where is he now? Anthony is living in Bryan, Texas with his wife Destiney and son Seth. He coaches at James Earl Rudder High School as the Varsity Running Backs, Varsity Secondary, and JV Boys Head Basketball Coach. He's in his 8th year coaching and 3rd year at Rudder High School.

PURPOSE: To recognize former Blackcat, Lady Cat, or Hilliard High School athletes or head coaches who have distinguished themselves beyond "the norm" and who have represented our community at a state or national level.

LOCATION: Foyer of the coaches offices at Bay City High School. The public is welcome to visit during regular office hours.

CRITERIA FOR NOMINATION:

Coaches:

- Must have been the Head Coach of a BCHS or Hilliard High School sport
- Automatic induction for State Championship

Players:

- Must be out of high school for at least five years
- Must have completed four years of college eligibility and participation with some special recognition or excellence

(or

- · High School State Champion in individual sport
- First Team All-State in any sport
- THSCA All-Star game or High School All-American designation
- Professional career (at least one full season)
- · National or Olympic Champion
- Teams: State Champions or State Finalists

SELECTION COMMITTEE: Made up of several long-time community members and/or school employees

NOMINATIONS: Nominations may be made by current or former coaches, family members, teachers, community members, or the media

NUMBER: Eight to 12 athletes and one to two coaches every other year -- in odd-numbered school years
