

PRE-EMPLOYMENT TRANSITION SERVICES



What are Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS)?

Pre-ETS are services and activities provided by vocational rehabilitation (VR) to help students with disabilities prepare for postsecondary education and employment.

Who are they for?

Any student in Texas can access Pre-ETS if they are:

- between the ages of 14 and 22,
- currently enrolled in school (includes homeschool, private school, and postsecondary education), and
- receiving special education services or qualify as a student with a disability under Section 504.

Postsecondary Goals

- What are the student's postsecondary goals in the areas of employment, education/training, and independent living, if applicable?

- How can vocational rehabilitation support the postsecondary goals?
- Will the student benefit from Pre-ETS?
- Which Pre-ETS activities would be most appropriate?

Counseling on Postsecondary Education

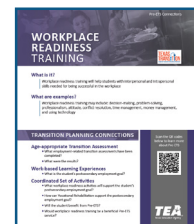
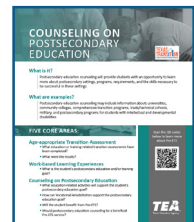
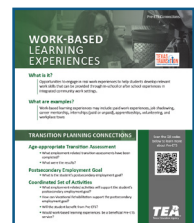
Learn how to complete a federal student aid application, explore scholarship options, and find options for further education through postsecondary education and training programs.
