McKinney Vento

Protects and ensures that children and youth experiencing homelessness have full and equal access to an appropriate public education.

Students living under any of these conditions: Living in a shelter, motel, hotel or weekly rate housing, house or apartment with more than one family because of economic hardship, in an abandoned building, in a car, at a campground or on the street, in substandard housing (without electricity, heat or water), and/or living with friends or family because you are a runaway or unaccompanied youth

A student is guaranteed enrollment in school. Services may include: Backpacks and school supplies upon request, assistance in finding health, welfare and other county resources, and/or make educational needs linkages in the community School enrollment assistance as needed

Military Connected

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires that Texas identify students with a parent who is an active-duty member of the Armed Forces, National Guard, or Reserves. This Military Student Identifier will allow educators and leaders to understand how military-connected children are performing in school.

The Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children (Military Compact) exists to strengthen transitions and close educational gaps as military families and their children move to a new school district in another state.

The Military Compact applies to Active-Duty Service Members, National Guard, Reserve, Veterans medically discharged or retired for one year, and members who die on active duty.

The Military Compact is focused on the following key topics:

- Educational records and enrollment
- Course and program placement and attendance
- Eligibility (student enrollment and extracurricular participation)
- Graduation

Foster Care

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires designated points of contact for child welfare and education agencies to support school stability for students in foster care (i.e., education best-interest, transportation coordination). Bay City's point of contact is the campus parent liaison with support of the District Parent Liaison.

The general term "foster care" for education purposes includes all students in the managing conservatorship (legal custody) of the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS). This includes students placed by DFPS with a Kinship caregiver, when the child remains in the legal custody of Texas DFPS
